Course Description: Senior English is designed for students to effectively apply a variety of reading and writing strategies using British literature as the content. Students will evaluate the author's use of literary elements and analyze classic and contemporary literature for the universality of themes. In writing, students will evaluate or critique a literary selection and craft a cohesive essay.

Course Objectives:

- Use a variety of writing techniques and reading strategies
- Identify literary elements in literature
- Gain a better understanding of elements of grammar through reading, writing and direct instruction
- Improve reading, writing, speaking, listening and presenting skills
- Write formal communication

Supplies: Students should come to class prepared to work. This includes having the following:

- Pen/pencils
- Grading pen (not blue or black)
- Paper
- highlighters
- flash drive
- 1.5-2" Binder
- Serious attitude

Behavior Expectations: As high school students, you are expected to behave with maturity. No excuses are accepted for coming to class unprepared or for missing and late work. Grade Expectations: Grades are established based upon participation, attendance, quizzes and tests, independent practice, essays, summative assessments, and presentations.

Late work is only accepted at my discretion. The grading scale is as follows:
